

WAYS TO HELP CCA

There are many ways in which you can help the students of CCA. The following is a list of those ways with a broad explanation of how each works. If you need further details (i.e., TRIP), please see the information on CCA's website. For answers to your questions, please call the office.

Aluminum Cans

Save your aluminum cans for recycling. Bring your cans in plastic bags to the Elementary Campus and place on unused stairs of the administration building (east). Money earned goes into the general fund.

Box Tops for Education

Save "Box Tops for Education" labels on the top of General Mills products and Betty Crocker products. These are worth 10 cents each. Check out their web site for all qualifying products at www.boxtops4education.com. Also, if you register on line, you can purchase on line from one of the listed stores and a percentage comes back to the school. At this time (through October 31, 2009) there is a contest to award 1,000,000 box top points (grand prize is 500,000 points; 500,000 X .10 = \$50,000; two second place prizes of 250,000 = \$25,000). After registering, you can submit your vote each day. If you have more than one email address (home and work), you can vote twice a day. The points will be awarded in November.

Century Club

Regular donations by check or draft payment from families, churches, or businesses can help CCA. Monthly donations can be made in any amount you choose. This money earned goes into the building fund.

Ink Jet Printer Cartridge

Save your empty ink cartridges (not laser) to recycle. Turn in your cartridges into either office. Money received from this endeavor goes into the general fund.

Office Depot

When purchasing school or office supplies, let the cashier know you are with CCA when you check out. CCA will receive 5% of your purchase amount. Our school number is 70040827. We receive gift cards to be used at Office Depot.

Super Valu Receipts

Turn in your Super Valu receipts to your teacher. CCA will receive 1% of your purchase amount that is then used to purchase needed items for the teacher's classroom.

T.R.I.P.

Tuition Reduction Incentive Plan is a great way to reduce your tuition. Inquire in the office for information about T.R.I.P. A full explanation of this program is also located on our web page at www.ccapaducah.org.

Nestle's Water Bottle Labels

We will be collecting the labels of Nestle's Water Bottles. Each label is worth two points and earned points can be used to purchase items (playground/PE equipment). On the last Casual Day of the month, we will also collect the bottles as a service project. A truck will be available to deliver them to the recycling center.

Campbell's Soup Labels

Start collecting the labels off of Campbell's soups and send them in to your teacher. If you would, please cut out the UPC code with the point value. The points saved through this project will be redeemed for computer software for the kindergarten and elementary campus computer labs.

SchoolMall

The SchoolMall Postcard Campaign begins in September of 2009. CCA receives money for each completed postcard and additional bonus money if CCA reaches its participation goal. Friends and family can shop SchoolMall online, select our school, and CCA will earn up to 40% on all orders. There are over 200 merchants; visit www.schoolmall.com for a complete list. In addition to SchoolMall online, a special brochure offering magazines and gift items will be mailed to friends and families. The program runs for one year, and CCA will receive checks periodically for money earned. Proceeds from this venture will go towards large playground equipment for the new school.
